



Delivering to building sites

Everyone associated with the building industry is being asked to prevent any pollution from entering the stormwater system because everything that goes down the drain ends up in our waterways.

The following guidelines are aimed at helping all the people responsible for delivering goods to building sites to keep our stormwater systems, rivers and beaches free from pollution.

Site disturbance

- Vehicles should enter and leave the site by the access driveway to limit the tracking of mud or soil on to roads.
- If any mud or soil is deposited on the roadway it must be removed as it is the delivery driver's responsibility to clean up any deposits left by the delivery vehicle. A broom or shovel, not a hose, must be used.
- Limit disturbance at a site when delivering materials.
- Always ensure that loads are covered to prevent any materials blowing off.

Noise

While construction activity is often noisy, delivery drivers are required to take steps to prevent or minimise any unreasonable impacts on the local community.

Noise not only results from construction-related tasks but also from vehicles parked on roadways with their engines running, as well as from radios and mobile phones.

Regular activity on construction sites should be restricted to between 7am and 7pm Monday to Saturday.

Noise and dust from building and construction sites (domestic and commercial) are common examples of a local nuisance which can have an adverse effect on the community.
